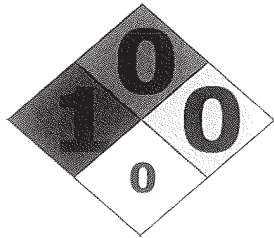

**Description of first aid measures**
